- Revelation 21: New heaven and a new earth, we have to see creation and community in new ways.

- Children of Israel—Wilderness. Leaving what you know. Seeming scarcity.
- Go out two by two and say peace (to all). Without many provisions
- Ruth gleaning, leaving things for those in need, making provisions for everyone.
- Jacob, Esau, Joseph and his family. Reconciliation, letting go of trust, fear. Unity.
- Body of Christ.
- Rehab—God can use anyone.
- Abrahamic Promise—No matter what I will be your God and you will be my people.
- Good Samaritan—help someone not like you, reaching out.
- Clearing the Pigs of demons—Go to the "other side" where it not always safe
- Loaves and Fishes—Wandering wilderness, manna provided, what you have will be enough, you give them something to eat—radical hospitality
- Can we feel fed?
- The Angel—Do not be Afraid!
- Acts—Functions of the church, community and caring
- Jesus and the Disciples—follow instructions, work out details as you go, one step at a time
- When community works together—everyone has enough
- Pentecost—transition to ministry, Jesus physically present
- Disciples acquiring donkey or colt for Jesus. They had a sense of purpose, willingness to focus, being sent outside the "group"
- John—So many people wanted to see Lazarus, intention of leaders to kill Lazarus as well as Jesus.
- We are not focused on Jesus, we are distracted.
- Jesus in the desert—looking for home and grumbling
- Gathering of children to Jesus
- Loaves and fishes for hospitality
- Noah and fresh start, rainbow colors and new community and confession
- Abraham and Sarah called to a new land (scary)
- Ezra and Nehemiah—prayer and rebuilding
- Acts—believers holding things in common
- Hagar and Ishmael—saved
- Book of Acts—sent into the world to do Jesus' work
- Time between Ascension and Pentecost
- Great Banquet and unfamiliar table
- Miriam's dance celebrating God's work
- Wilderness—Exodus
- Micah 6:8
- Jesus—yesterday, today, tomorrow
- Parables of the lost, mustard seeds, growing to a tree from something small
- Jesus going off to pray

Biblical Images that Remind us of What God's Preferred Future Is....

- Joshua—reminder of faith across the Jordan, conversation better than conflict
- · Fool rebuilding barns and accumulating
- Phoenix—rising and dying
- Find the Risen Christ, where is Jesus?
- The Church preaches realism in a culture of fantasy, the battle is real
- Three days entombed, sitting in stuck times
- We have a priority of comfort, discomfort is avoided, instead of seeing this as a part of growth and change
- Commitment—are we willing to die, a daily question
- Dying and Resurrection, over and over
- Operating on Fear: A culture of fear
- Jesus spent three years in ministry to get welcomed on Palm Sunday and then by the Cross
- Ephesians 5 Callings, beyond deacons, elders
