**UCC Thursdays in Black Summit:** On Wednesday November 13 and 20, under the auspices of Thursdays in Black ambassador Rev Dr Karen Georgia Thompson, participants assembled with facilitators to learn more about how to partner in breaking the chains of gender and sexual based violence through deconstructing biblical narratives, witnessing through various actions, overturning social media's influence on youth, violence prevention and anti-trafficking work. People Powered has launched a call for applications as part of efforts to strengthen citizen participation in policy-making, under its **Inclusive Democracy Accelerator (IDA)** to help public institutions and civil society organizations engage youth, women, and displaced people more effectively in participatory decision-making. Apply for the opportunity to receive a six-month practice-oriented training opportunity, including attendance at a two-day international workshop in Nairobi, Kenya (travel expenses covered). Eligible organizations (public institutions or civil society organizations) should be located in Latin America, Africa, Asia, or Eastern Europe (<u>check full eligibility here</u>).

Justice Denied: Fighting Widespread Impunity for Conflict-Related Sexual Violence (CRSV) (June 2–3, 2025, Melbourne, Australia).

A two-day conference, hosted by the Australian Research Council Centre of Excellence for the Elimination of Violence Against Women (CEVAW) and the Australian Institute of International Affairs Victoria (AIIA-VIC), will focus on addressing impunity for CRSV, fostering collaboration, and identifying innovative approaches to justice and accountability, specifically in the Indo-Pacific region.
